Preparing for Installation

Please follow these guidelines to ensure a smooth installation. If you have any questions, please contact us anytime. If you would like us to confirm your sink or faucet will work, feel free to bring them in prior to templating.

- Granite and Quartz surface thickness, including backsplash, is usually 1¼". Marble, limestone, travertine, and other types of stone may vary.
- All tops will have radius corners unless otherwise requested by the customer.
- Please allow no more than 12" of unsupported stone (overhang) on one level tops without support brackets. All half walls with raised tops typically need support brackets or posts.
- Please check the cutout size (bowl opening) of your sink. When purchasing a new kitchen or bathroom sink, please follow the templates below. Cutout sizes (or bowl openings) should not exceed the following sizes.
- Please be sure your sink fits in your cabinet. The sizes above work in standard 24" deep kitchen cabinets and 21" deep vanity cabinets. Keep in mind that all Eclipse sinks fit in standard cabinets. If your cabinets are NOT standard sizes, you may have to select a different sink. Triple bowl kitchen sinks require a larger cabinet base.
- Please check your faucet to ensure the fixture, handle, and plunger will not interfere or be obstructed by the backsplash. Use caution when purchasing a single hone faucet for your bathroom. The plunger may hit the backsplash, especially if it is 1¼" material. If you have an offset bowl for a kitchen sink, no holes can be drilled on the side of the larger bowl, so be sure not to purchase a faucet with a separate hot and cold handle.
- All cabinets must be fully installed and all necessary appliances and fixtures, including sinks, faucets, soap dispensers, cooktop, and slide in range must be on the jobsite for the scheduled template date.
- All existing tops must be removed prior to scheduled template date, unless previously contracted for The Granite Company to remove. The Granite Company's contracted removal does not include plumbing or electrical disconnection, as we are not licensed in these areas. In addition, The Granite Company cannot remove or modify cabinetry.
